The San Ramon Historic Foundation had a VERY successful Sheep Shearing event on April 22, 2017! Hats off to Tony King and Cindy Duffy for organizing this very popular event! This year we had the biggest crowd ever. There were crowds watching Patty and her crew shear sheep, families enjoying live music by the Olympic Fields Brass Band, children playing old fashioned games and everyone enjoying the beautiful, sunny Spring event. Picnic tables were crowded with people eating the Foundation's famous hot dogs and snacking on caramel corn. Thanks to all our members and volunteers for making this so successful!

Every event that the Foundation sponsors is for a special purpose! We are a nonprofit 501(c)(3) and all funds raised for the past few years have been put into our Ole 1850's Barn project. The Barn is located on Forest Home Farms, San Ramon's only Historic Park. The site was donated to the City of San Ramon by Ruth Boone, in honor of her husband Travis Boone, a direct descendent of Daniel Boone. Forest Home Farms is on the National Registry of Historic Homes and Parks, so everything needs to be documented. The Foundation's role in this project has been very exciting. The Foundation pledged \$250,000 toward the Ole 1850's Barn construction. At our Board Meeting of March 29, 2017, we gave the City of San Ramon a check for \$83,333 which we earned from our four major events of the year: Crab Feed, Sheep Shearing, Oktoberfest and Holiday on the Farm! Update on the Old Barn Restoration

In an effort to reduce costs and speed up the project's completion, the construction crew has devised a new method for stabilizing the Barn. Instead of completely taking down the building as originally planned, the crew has trenched on the north and south sides, will pour the new foundation, then re-assemble the footing (old beams) on top of the new foundation. Next, they will trench the east and west sides and repeat the process. Internal bracing will support the building until the footings and support beams are in place. Once that is completed, the rest of the interior work, roofing, etc. will begin. Estimated completion is late summer or early fall 2017.

Sheep Shearing Event Big Success

Seventeen years ago, a group of Co-op Sheep farmers began shearing their sheep at Forest Home Farms and in 2010 the San Ramon Historic Foundation (SRHF) took over the Sheep Shearing event. Since then the SRHF has developed it into the largest event the Foundation holds yearly. The 2017 Sheep Shearing Event was held in tradition on the third Saturday of the month, April 22.

This year we had a wonderful turnout of guests from our community. An estimated 1,400 people came out to support the SRHF, experience a day on the 16-acre Boone family farm and watch the sheep get their annual haircut. 100% of the profit from the entry fees, gift shop and food and beverage revenue go to support the San Ramon Historic Foundation.

A total of 57 sheep received their annual haircuts and provided us an opportunity to demonstrate the wool process from the sheep to spin into yarn – all while the sheep dogs are herding the next sheep into line to get their haircut.

This year many of the historic buildings were open for guests to browse, many of which are listed on California's Historic Landmarks. Live music played in the open barn, children were entertained with Vintage Games, Crafts, Face Painting and 4H Animals. The Maypole and its beautiful colors inspired us all to celebrate the coming of spring.

Within the 7,000 sq. foot open barn we had Quilters, Wood Carvers and Lace Makers and the Walnut Barn was open with a walnut truck game. The Walnut building has a significant value to the San Ramon Valley as Travis Boone invented much of the walnut process. Men and women alike continue to enjoy the Tractor Museum and Hit and Miss Engines.

The Welcome Center Farm was open and tours, docents, and farm hands were available to provide more information and history throughout the day. We always encourage a picnic lunch and many guests purchased food & refreshment and enjoyed their lunch on the farm.
