The San Ramon Historic Foundation had a very successful CRAB FEED on January 27, 2018! It was completely SOLD out! The crab had to be ordered the week before the event and we were very fortunate to be able to get ample for our huge crowd. Some events in the Bay Area had to be canceled because there was no crab left. SO mark your calendars NOW for the last weekend in January 2019 for our ANNUAL CRAB FEED. It is always so much fun and helps support our OLD 1850 Barn restoration.

Our next major event is **SHEEP SHEARING DAY at the FARM on Saturday, April 21, from 11AM to 3PM!** This is an annual event and last year we had over 1600 people attend this popular family outing. One of the highlights is watching Patsy Galati work her magic with her border collie, who herds sheep and keeps them in line so they can be sheared. Patsy has been at the Farm since 1998 and showcases her sheep and horses for the enjoyment of the entire San Ramon community. Field trips to learn about the sheep is a highlight for younger students. This two-hour program can be booked by calling 973-3284. On Sheep Shearing Day, all the events are covered with the entrance fee. (early bird = adults \$5, kids \$3, under 3 years = free.) Other activities on Sheep Shearing Day include visits to the Tractor Museum and tours of the Glass House (which does have a fee). *Visit www.srhf.org for more information & to purchase tickets.*
