Meeting to Review Future Projects

In September, the San Ramon Historic Foundation Board and City Staff met at Forest Home Farms to do a facility review and to look at future projects to be funded by the City and Foundation. The following City staff attended: Marty Gonzales, Joe Pachen and Scott Rennicks from Public Services, Robin Bartlett from Engineering, Brad Morris, Adam Chow, and Jessica Raeber from Parks and Community Services. San Ramon Historic Board members at this meeting included Dall Barley, Shirley Ernest, Patsy Galati, Rene Kullick, Pat Boom, H. Abram Wilson and Carol Rowley. We reviewed 16 structures and made notes about what was needed to preserve the structure or increase its functional use. A small committee was created to bring forward next steps to the Board and City. This will determine which projects will be funded. Watch for future news, as the Farm needs constant upgrading!

Tractor Rides

The tractor and engine maintenance volunteers offer rides during events such as Halloween Trick or Treat, Holiday at the Farm and Sheep Shearing Day. The rides are very popular and are busy during the entire event. There is no charge for the rides, but donations are accepted.



A deck was added to a 1935 Caterpillar BTW Model Twenty-Two, the Creepy Crawler,

accommodates 10 riders. The ride is made exciting by tight spin turns and a few lurches.

More recently the volunteers used a variety of parts and built a surrey that is pulled by a cute 1950 Farmall Cub. This ride is gentler than the Creepy Crawler except when it traverses the mounds made by the Caterpillar. The Cub also occasionally takes a path through the trees.

Many visitors ride both vehicles. It is a fun day for the tractor group, as well, and also shows that our tractors are more than just show, they work hard.
