Located at 19953 San Ramon Valley Boulevard, San Ramon, is the current focus of the San Ramon Historic Foundation's efforts. The property was bequeathed to the City of San Ramon in the 1990s by its owner, Ruth Quayle Boone, with the understanding that it become a City Park.

It is open Tuesday through Saturday from 10am to 4pm, closed Sunday and Monday. Family groups are welcome to come and enjoy the rural farm atmosphere.

Farmer Recognition Award






Oh, BY Gosh, By Golly ...
