#### FOREST HOME FARMS HISTORIC PARK

Located at 19953 San Ramon Valley Boulevard, San Ramon, Forest Home Farms is the current focus of the San Ramon Historic Foundation's efforts. The property was bequeathed to the City of San Ramon in the 1990s by its owner, Ruth Quayle Boone, with the understanding that it become a city park.

It is open Tuesday through Saturday from 10 AM to 4 PM, closed Sunday and Monday. All are welcome to come and enjoy the rural farm atmosphere.

The San Ramon Historic Foundation depends on grants from the community to fund continuing educational programs and special projects at Forest Home Farms. In 2023, we were privileged to receive the following grants:

The Kiwanis Club of San Ramon Valley grant helped fund an audio tour program at Forest Home Farms.

- Visitors can pick up a tour brochure at the kiosk near the Welcome Center or the Gift Shoppe.
- The tour brochure explains how to access **Otocast** via their cellphones.
- The self-guided audio tour allows visitors to learn about the historical site and enrich their experience at the Farm at their own pace and convenience.

The **Dublin/San Ramon Women's Club** grant helped fund the elementary school program, which educates students about early farm life in the San Ramon Valley at Forest Home Farms Historic Park.

• This year, almost every third-grade student in the area will have visited the Farm to participate in hands-on activities and learn about local history and life in the San Ramon Valley during the late 1800s and early 1900s.



# Meet Our Board Members

**Carol Rowley**, a 54-year resident of San Ramon, has served our community as an educator, school administrator, and civic leader. Because of her love of children and interest in developing more parks, she volunteered for the San Ramon Parks & Recreation Commission in 1990. She was therefore one of the city representatives who met with Ruth Boone to discuss the possibility of her donating the property to the city as a historical park. Mrs. Boone felt very strongly about preserving this land. Carol is proud to have played a key role in preserving the Boone House and paving the way for the Forest Home Farms Historic Park we know and love today.

As Country Club Elementary School Principal, she and her staff created the first farm life curriculum. Her students were the first to attend what is now the Third-Grade Early Farm Life School Program. Carol saw the looks of amazement and delight on the children's faces as they learned about pioneer lifeways in San Ramon.

As a City Council member (elected in 2003), Carol's involvement in the Farm continued to grow. She joined the SRHF Board in 2011 and has been president since 2016. Carol shares Ruth's profound love for the property, and is passionate about preserving, in her words, "living history." She encourages anyone interested in contributing to their community to reach out and learn how they can help.

**Julia Oseland** currently serves as the San Ramon Historic Foundation's Vice President and Membership Director. As VP, she has been instrumental in increasing membership and bringing a fresh perspective and new ideas forward. Additionally, she created the popular Summer Speaker Series for the Foundation members, now going into its third year. Julia has always been enamored of historic properties, the stories they tell, and the value their preservation brings for future generations.
