Grant Approved for Manure Spreader By Yuna Karpelevitch

The San Ramon Historic Foundation recently acquired a 1960s-era manure spreader with the help of a San Ramon Rotary Club grant. The manure spreader will be used to fertilize the organic garden at Forest Home Farms. It is a great tool for evenly distributing manure through the soil, allowing plants to get necessary nutrients, and avoiding any problems otherwise caused by uneven fertilization. Keep an eye out for the upcoming demonstration of the manure spreader in action!

We Have a New Sheep Barn Floor

We are so excited about the restoration of the 1920 Sheep Barn floor. The Foundation Board approved funding for the project in late 2023 and with the help of proceeds from the annual Crab Feed were able to get the project completed in early 2024. The City's Public Service staff was a great partner in framing and pouring the cement. The Sheep Barn now has new concrete floors and a deck for hay storage. In Patsy Galati's words (FHF very own shepherd), "the hay storage is readily available to feed the sheep, especially during the raining season. No more soggy hay!" While we don't really know what the sheep are thinking, they probably really do appreciate this!
