Carol held various positions on the board and ended her tenure as Secretary of the Board. As secretary, Carol played a critical role ensuring proper management of important organizational records and minutes of Board meetings. In addition, under her leadership Carol was instrumental in establishing one of the Foundation's biggest fund raisers, the Annual Crab Feed held in January.
